10 Standout Painters to Discover From Independent New York 2016

This year, however, it's chockablock with paintings and "ain'tings" of every size, shape, and support. Robert Barber Kerry Schuss



Dating from the 1970s, these "Freeway Paintings" inspired by underpasses and overpasses near San Francisco introduce the 93-year-old Barber as an <u>Ellsworth Kelly</u> of the American highway system. His first New York solo exhibition opens on March 19 at <u>Kerry Schuss</u>'s gallery on the Lower East Side.
